



HUGH SCULLY MD FELLOW

Hugh Scully attended Queen's University, the University of Toronto and Harvard University, and holds a Bachelor's degree in biology and chemistry, a Master of Science degree (M.Sc), and a Doctorate of Medicine (M.D.). He is a Fellow {qualified specialist} of the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada in General Surgery and Cardiovascular and Thoracic Surgery, and is a Fellow of the American College of Surgeons and of the American College of Cardiology. He has held numerous positions in the medical field including Chief of Staff, Deputy Surgeon-in-Chief and Senior Cardiac Surgeon at the Toronto General Hospital. He is Professor of Surgery and Health Policy at the University of Toronto's Faculty of Medicine. He has served as President of the Canadian Cardiovascular Society, the Canadian Medical Association and on the Council of the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada and the World Medical Association. Presently he is a Governor of the American College of Surgeons.

Scully's medical role in motor sport is widespread. From 1971 to 2002, he was the President and Founding Member of Ontario Race Physicians. From 1968 to 1992, he was Medical Director for the Canadian Grand Prix at Mosport and subsequently in Montreal. He has also been Medical/Safety Director of the CART/Champ Car races in Toronto and Edmonton. He was elected to the Canadian Motorsport Hall of Fame in 2000. He is Chairman of the International Council of Motorsport Sciences {Indianapolis} and became a Founding Fellow of the FIA Institute when it was created in 2004. Presently he serves on the FIA Medical Commission.
